Conservation Project









Chester Zoo have been working alongside our young people this half term on a conservation project. Young people have been looking at environmental concerns, sustainability of products and changes in the natural world. They were fascinated to see some of the objects that were brought as a starting point to look at and consider when discussing key threats to animals such as poaching. Young people were very thoughtful when giving their views and thoughts on the issued discussed. The final sesion of the conservation project was a trip to Chester Zoo. Young people were given a tour of some of the

aminal houses and had the opportunity to ask any questions they had about the animals, their habitats and diets.

STEAM

Through our STEAM lessons this half term, we have explored the makeup of planets through experimenting with brusho paints to create different surface effects. We have also used paper to make bowls in a sustainable craft task. We used old maps for this example and we think it looks








fabulous! We have explored forces through experimentation with bottle rockets made from drinking water bottles, and catapults made from lolly sticks. We have enjoyed the competitive element of the longest paper chain challenge! All of these tasks have encouraged the young people to think logically and critically and develop their skills in patience, resilience and perseverance.

Our amazing artists!! – In art we have been exploring ideas of identity and what makes up outr personalities, what are our values and how are they formed. We have also been exploring the work of Hanah Hock through experimenting with collage. The young people have made their own empositions and we think they've been really successful.

Virtual Work Experience with the Bank of America

All our young people were offered the opportunity to do some vitual work experience with an international company – The Bank of America. Their task was to research and produce an information sheet for customers on the prevention of financial crimes. We started the session with a bit of history about money and how in Roman times people traded with salt as a currency (hence the term salary). We then moved on to look the current climate. The young people already had a lot of knowledge about terms like phishing, smishing and vishing. They were also very savvy about identity theft and how they would advise people to keep themselves safe. It was a great opportunity for everyone involved.




Challenge...


- Can you think of a sentence that includes the word "mint"
- What is the Royal Mint?
- The Royal Mint is the United Kingdom's official maker of British coins. It is the oldest company in the United Kingdom and is currently located in Llantrisant, Wales, where it moved to in 1968.
- The Royal Mint operated within the Tower of London for several hundred years before moving to Royal Mint Court in London, where it remained until the 1960s.
- The word "mint" comes from the Latin word "moneta" which is also where the word "money" comes from.



It's all about the Christmaths!

During the Autumn term we have looked at a range of topics in our maths lessons. These have included working with percentages, Pythagoras' simplifying expressions, Theorem (see diagram!) and more recently some Christmaths puzzles. The young people have engaged well and have made great progress. One of my favourite aspects of our group maths sessions is the support and help the young people give each other with the work. It is lovely to see them working both collaboratively and occasions on competitively!
